Anthony's grave at Mount Hope Cemetery, Rochester. The automobiles will start from Van Cleef Lake, Seneca Falls, at 11 o'clock. This trip will include a visit to Miss Anthony's former home in Rochester. All members of the Conference are invited by the Chamber of Commerce to be their guests on this occasion, and no charge will be made for the automobile trip.
