

### **Session Briefs**

Meeting of December 14, 2015

- Heard Treasurer's report for November; total Revenues were \$21,776; total Expenses \$21,644; Fund Raisers [crafts, Amazon, raffles, TOPS cards, etc.] net total to date \$1,191. An updated budget draft for 2016 projects \$176,450 in Revenues and \$176,450 in Total Expenses. [Final budget can be established once all pledges are returned]
- Settled on structure for next Annual Meeting of the Congregation, January 24, 2016 to take place during the worship service
- Asked to consider how best to use the church's portion of the Peacemaking offering
- Heard of Property Ministry meeting with representative of solar panel firm, early this week
- Moved to task Property Ministry with prioritizing items on NYSERDA list of suggested energysaving improvements for all church buildings
- Learned of snow-removal arrangement with Frank Caratozzolo
- Learned of energy-efficient appliances purchased for manse, awaiting delivery [refrigerator, washing machine, clothes dryer, and freezer]. These items were purchased for half of the budgeted amount.
- Heard plans for Property Ministry to winterize windows at manse
- Looked at updated job description for church treasurer
- Received information from Presbytery of Geneva for pastor and church staff salaries, suggesting a 2% increase
- Learned that one pothole in driveway has been filled and discovery of a second, larger one in the parking lot
- Had further discussion on acquisition of an atrial defibrillator and agreed to raise the question at Annual Meeting
- Christian Ed will fill goody bags for young children and distribute them on Christmas Eve

I remember riding my bike for the first time without training wheel. My dad stood behind me and gave me a gentle push down a small slope in our backyard. It was not until I finally came to a stop that I realized my dad had been running the whole time behind me, making sure that I didn't fall. I was not alone.
